WAYS OF BIOWASTE MANAGEMENT IN PRAGUE AND IN SELECTED MAJOR CITIES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

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Biowaste or waste subject to the anaerobic or aerobic decomposition has become a problematic component of the municipal waste due to the use of green spaces, especially in the large cities with a high population density. Biowaste can be seen as a source of the hazardous methane released by landfilling, but thanks to the principles of the circular economy we return to its essence – a source of nutrients and organic matter for agricultural land and urban greenery.
